

# CAN IT GO IN THE ORGANICS (COMPOST) BIN?

(Updated July 1, 2007)

The Banff compost facility is designed for processing solids left over from the waste water treatment process. Until we learn which additional organic materials this process can effectively compost we are being cautious about the materials we collect for composting. Your co-operation in placing only currently acceptable food waste items in the bins is appreciated..

- With the exception of meats and bones most solid food waste can go in the organics bins.
- Plastic of any kind must not be placed in the bins
- Please cut large items into smaller pieces.
- Liquids or semi-liquid material such as yogurt and sour cream may be rinsed down the drain with used water such as dirty dish water.

Here is a list of items you may be wondering about. We will update this list as we learn more about our ability to compost organics wastes in Banff.

## Green means YES

Separate these materials from your garbage and place them in the organics bins located on Cave Avenue or in the recycling depots located behind the Fire Hall and on Hawk Avenue in the industrial area.

## Red means NO

Please continue to place these materials in your regular garbage bin.
